**Day of Arising, ELW 374,** by Susan Palo Cherwien (1953-2021) is based on Luke 24:13-35, the meeting with the risen Christ on the road to Emmaus. Structured in brief lines of five and four syllables, it almost has the character of an evocative meditative haiku, with ample space for the light to dawn on the disciples and on us.

Day of arising, Christ on the roadway, unknown companion walks with his own. When they invite him, as fades the first day, and bread is broken, Christ is made known.

> When we are walking, doubtful and dreading, blinded by sadness, slowness of heart, yet Christ walks with us, ever awaiting our invitation: Stay, do not part.


