Breathing Together is a text about <u>the holy act of singing together</u> by Rusty Edwards (b. 1955), a Lutheran pastor, teacher, and hymnwriter. His hymns have been published in hymn books used by forty denominations in over a dozen countries. His songs have been sung on every continent, including at Chapel of the Snows in Antarctica! Five of his hymns are in our hymnal, including *We All Are One in Mission (ELW 576)* and *Praise the One Who Breaks the Darkness (ELW 843)*.

Breathing together in singing God's songs Makes us connected like nothing else can. Just for the moment, our differences gone. Hymns are a part of God's musical plan.

Inhale, to start things, and exhale to sing. Soon there is harmony. Song has begun. Then in the sharing, our voices will bring Words all together, united as one.

Peace into breathing, and joy in the sound. Love in the offering of each new phrase. No other place can the balance be found. Breathing together is giving God's praise.

Centuries pass, and the hymns still go on! Miriam to David, from Luther to now. Let us keep sharing the gospel in song Breathing together is our sacred vow.
