Dear Trinity Lutheran Family,

We experienced panic when we saw the increasing rates of property insurance when renewal time arrived. We were plagued with anxiety when waiting for a Synod response to the financial information that we sent for the Call Process. Slowly, hope came along when our Call Committee was formed. Needless to say, we have ridden an emotional rollercoaster together.

The last year has transformed Trinity. We no longer worship exactly the same. We no longer congregate exactly the same. While we maintain our Lutheran traditions, we have most definitely changed as a congregation. I see every challenge that we have encountered force us from our comfort zone. Like a pebble at the beach, we have had waves of challenges wash over us. It is a year later and we are a bit weathered, but definitely smoother than before.

Change is not easy, but we are doing the work and God sees that. We have made it through every challenge by God's loving grace. I know that with every low point we have faced, a new door has somewhere been opened.

What can we do now? Most importantly, we must "keep on, keeping on". Continue doing what makes us Trinity Lutheran Church: worship, partaking in ministries that help those outside of Trinity's doors and spreading the good news of our Lord and Savior. Remember to take care of our beloved members who are not able to make it to church. Completing and returning the survey created by the Call Committee is crucial to having a church profile that accurately reflects the thoughts and feelings of Trinity. These are what we can do to continue moving forward in the Call Process. Let us pray that when we review 2024, we will be doing it with our new pastor.

Cantor's Notes

"We believe that the holy act of singing together shapes faith, heals brokenness, transforms lives, and renews peace."

The guiding stance of *The Center for Congregational Song* of the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada.

Dazzling Presence on the Mountain, ACS 917, was written for a Transfiguration hymn festival at Wartburg College in Waverly, Iowa, in 2014. The text gives us an expanded understanding of Christ's mountaintop experience for believers in our own day. Becoming dwellings for justice, mercy, and compassion in the world can bring transfiguration to the earth and all living creatures.

The text was written by Pastor Paul E. Hoffman, b. 1956, who is called by the Northwest Washington Synod of the ELCA to serve as a writer and teacher. Having served as a parish pastor for over thirty years, he has been active in worship renewal and evangelization, a combination that finds its intersection in bringing new Christians to baptism, the subject of Faith Forming Faith. Paul has lectured and taught about adult faith formation in such diverse places as St. Petersburg, Russia; Gettysburg Seminary; the Calvin College Institute for Worship; in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Estonia; at the Catholic Institute in Paris; and at countless congregations and synodical gatherings across the United States

Dazzling presence on the mountain: human eye had never seen such a wonder, such resplendence, heaven and earth in cloud convene. "This is my Son, the beloved," thunderous voice from cloud exclaimed. Word made flesh to heal creation, to disciples God proclaimed.

From this mount of mystic splendor to the cross Christ presses on; here no Moses nor Elijah, only thieves Christ's wings adorn.
"Lord, have mercy, Christ, have mercy," was one's penitential sigh. With transfiguring assurance, Christ rejoins his fervent cry.

From the heights of new creation, Christ beholds his world, redeemed; as with Peter and companions, brings us now to sights unseen. Justice, mercy, and compassion: these the booths he bids us build, that the earth he loves may flourish as each life with grace is filled.

Let our praise ring from each mountain, into deepest valleys pour, where, with lives of grateful service, we adore Christ evermore. To the Son, God's own beloved, and the Spirit endlessly, may the church's praise be lifted to the blessed Trinity.
